### God: Reality or Delusion?

Dr Daniel Scott

Is faith in God outdated in a scientific age? Is God real or merely a delusion, as some claim? At Hereford's Courtyard on Tuesday September 23<sup>rd</sup>, Dr Daniel Scott will share his perspective as a former theoretical physicist who has become instead a practical Christian. He will give solid and scientific grounds for faith by uprooting misconceptions about God and revealing a concept of God that is credible, dependable and relevant to the challenges we face individually, nationally and internationally such as health, the economy and global stability.

As a young teenager, Daniel Scott was fascinated with theoretical physics and went on to spend seven years at Cambridge University where he earned a PhD in an abstract branch of mathematical physics, also becoming a published mathematician. However, by the time he had finished his PhD, his intention to be a physicist had been superseded by a growing interest in scientific metaphysics. His desire to find answers to the big questions of "Life, the universe and everything!" had sparked his initial interest in fundamental physics, but he gradually realised that the deepest answers are not to be found in mathematics or physics but in spirituality. In fact, he found that Christianity can be taken seriously as a science. This discovery led to a sharp turn in career plans and for ten years, now, Daniel has been working full time in Christian Science healing.

From this depth of experience Daniel will show that prayer can have a truly scientific basis when the nature of God is understood. He contends that such understanding can be gained by everyone giving them practical healing power in their own lives and the proof that God does indeed exist.

Daniel's speaking engagements have included schools, universities, youth, church, and interfaith groups. He presented a paper at the 2005 UK Science and Religion Forum Conference at Oxford University, and has lectured at the Bath Royal Literary and Scientific Institution. He is keen to point out that he has never stopped being a scientist, but he is now much more interested in the Science of spirituality than the science of materiality.

The ideas explored in his talk are based on the Christian Science which has its roots in the Bible and is explained in the book *Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures* by Mary Baker Eddy.
